In Germany there are highly specialized centres for hereditary breast and ovarian cancer.

These centres provide people with a confirmed or suspected genetic cancer risk with all-around help: with competent advice, genetic testing, diagnosis, treatment and research.

Please contact one of these centres when one or more of the following applies to at least one line of your family*:

- at least three women who have or have had breast cancer, independent of their ages
- at least two women who have or have had breast cancer, at least one of them before the age of 51
- at least one woman who has or has had breast cancer, and one woman who has or has had ovarian cancer
- at least two women who have or have had ovarian cancer
- at least one woman who has or has had breast and ovarian cancer
- at least one woman 35 years of age or younger who has or has had breast cancer
- at least one woman 50 years of age or younger who has or has had breast cancer in both breasts
- one man who has or has had breast cancer and a woman who has or has had breast or ovarian cancer independent of their ages
- one woman who has or has had triple-negative breast cancer before the age of 51
- one woman who has or has had ovarian cancer before the age of 71
- (one man who has or has had breast cancer)
This criterion is uncertain and is the subject of further research involving studies at the specialist centres.

* First and second degree relatives on the maternal and paternal sides

Breast and ovarian cancer caused by hereditary mutations

Cancer is caused by mutations in the DNA. These gene mutations are hereditary in more than 20 percent of all cases of breast and ovarian cancer – in other words, they can be passed on to the next generation. The most well known breast cancer genes are BRCA 1 and BRCA 2.

A mutation can be carried by mothers as well as fathers. Hereditary breast and ovarian cancer occurs more frequently in the affected families, and can even affect young people.

Women and men in these high-risk families often ask the same questions, such as:

- Should I have a genetic test?
- What consequences will the results of the genetic testing have on me and my relatives?
- Is it prudent to have a prophylactic operation?
- Does the mutation affect my personal partnership and my sexuality?
- How does it affect my desire to have children?
- What are my rights and obligations with respect to my insurance?
